What is the overall <u>deductible</u> ? If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> ?	Yes. <u>Preventive care</u> , office visits, certain lab tests, most <u>prescription drugs</u> , and <u>urgent care</u> and recovery services at independent facilities, are covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . You pay more if you use a <b>provider</b> in Tier B. You will pay the most if you use an out-of-network provider, and you might receive a bill from a <b>provider</b> for the difference between the <b>provider's</b> charge and what your <b>plan</b> pays ( <b>balance billing</b> ). Be aware your <b>network provider</b> might use an out-of-network provider for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <b>provider</b> before you get services.
Do you need a <u>referral</u> to see a <u>specialist</u> ?	No.	You can see the <u>specialist</u> you choose without a <u>referral</u> .
