Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall deductible ?	\$1,500 individual / \$3,000 family	Generally, you must pay all the costs from providers up to the deductible amount before this plan begins to pay. If you have other family members on the plan , each family member must meet their own individual deductible until the total amount of deductible expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family deductible .
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible ?	Yes. Preventive care , emergency room care, office visits, and outpatient rehabilitation/habilitation therapies are covered before you meet your deductible . Also covered before you meet your deductible are certain tests and outpatient surgeries at independent facilities, and most prescription drugs .	This plan covers some items and services if you haven't yet met the deductible amount. But a copayment or coinsurance may apply. For example, this plan covers certain preventive services without cost-sharing and before you meet your deductible . See a list of covered preventive services at https://www.healthcare.gov/coverage/preventive-care-benefits/ .
Are there other deductibles for specific services?	Yes. \$65 per child for Pediatric Dental. Doesn't apply to the overall deductible . There are no other specific deductibles .	You must pay all of the costs for these services up to the specific deductible amount before this plan begins to pay for these services.
What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan ?	\$6,000 individual / \$12,000 family Pediatric Dental is limited to \$350 per child or \$700 for 2 or more children.	The out-of-pocket limit is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this plan , they have to meet their own out-of-pocket limits until the overall family out-of-pocket limit has been met.
What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit ?	Premiums , pediatric dental deductible , prescription drug brand additional charges or manufacturer assistance, and services this plan doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit .
Will you pay less if you use a network provider ?	Yes. See www.avmed.org or call 1-800-376-6651 for a list of network providers .	This plan uses a provider network . You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's network. You will pay the most if you use an out-of-network provider , and you might receive a bill from a provider for the difference between the provider's charge and what your plan pays (balance billing). Be aware your network provider might use an out-of-network provider for some services (such as lab work). Check with your provider before you get services.
Do you need a referral to see a specialist ?	Yes.	This plan will pay some or all of the costs to see a specialist for covered services but only if you have a referral before you see the specialist .

If your [plan](#) doesn't meet the [Minimum Value Standards](#), you may be eligible for a [premium tax credit](#) to help pay for a [plan](#) through the [Marketplace](#).
