What is the overall deductible?  AvMed Network: \$8,100 individual / \$16,200 family out-of-Network: \$24,300 individual / \$48,600 family amount of deduction deduction deduction deduction in the control of the control o		Generally, you must pay all the costs from providers up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members onto the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .		
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible?	Yes. <u>Preventive care</u> , office visits, certain lab tests, certain <u>prescription drugs</u> and <u>urgent care</u> services are covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> .	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost-sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . Are there other <u>deductibles</u> for specific services?	Yes. <b>\$65</b> per child for Pediatric Dental. Doesn't apply to the overall <u>deductible</u> . There are no other specific <u>deductibles</u> .	You must pay all of the costs for these services up to the specific <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay for these services.		
What is the <u>out-of-pocket</u> <u>limit</u> for this <u>plan</u> ?	AvMed Network: \$8,200 individual / \$16,400 family Out-of-Network: \$24,600 individual / \$49,200 family Pediatric Dental is limited to \$350 per child or \$700 for 2 or more children.	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met.		
What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit?	Premiums, pediatric dental <u>deductible</u> , <u>prescription</u> <u>drug</u> brand additional charges or manufacturer assistance, <u>balance billing</u> charges, and health care this <u>plan</u> doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <u>out-of-pocket</u> <u>limit</u> .		
Will you pay less if you use a <u>network provider</u> ?	Yes. See www.avmed.org or call 1-800-376-6651 for a list of network providers.	This <u>plan</u> uses a <u>provider network</u> . You will pay less if you use a <u>provider</u> in the <u>plan's</u> network. You will pay the most if you use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> , and you might receive a bill from a <u>provider</u> for the difference between the provider's charge and what your <u>plan</u> pays ( <u>balance billing</u> ). Be aware your <u>network provider</u> might use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <u>provider</u> before you get services.		
Do you need a referral to see a specialist?	No.	You can see the <u>specialist</u> you choose without a <u>referral</u> .

Your Grievance and Appeals Rights: There are agencies that can help if you have a complaint against your plan for a denial of a claim. This complaint is called a grievance or appeal. #### Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes.

<u>Minimum Essential Coverage</u> generally includes plans, health insurance available through the <u>Marketplace</u> or other individual market policies, Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP, TRICARE, and certain other coverage. If you are eligible for certain types of <u>Minimum Essential Coverage</u>, you may not be eligible for the premium tax credit.

## Does this plan meet Minimum Value Standards? Yes.

If your plan doesn't meet the Minimum Value Standards, you may be eligible for a premium tax credit to help you pay for a plan through the Marketplace.

This is not a cost estimator. Treatments shown are just examples of how this <u>plan</u> might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your <u>providers</u> charge, and many other factors. Focus on the <u>cost sharing</u> amounts (<u>deductibles</u>, <u>copayments</u> and <u>coinsurance</u>) and <u>excluded services</u> under the <u>plan</u>. Use this information to compare the portion of costs you might pay under different health <u>plans</u>. Please note these coverage examples are based on self-only coverage.
